**Breve descrizione**

Recent events – such as the war in Ukraine or the Covid-19 pandemic – have shown that conflicts and other disasters generate emergency situations having a significant impact on the enjoyment of fundamental human rights by EU and third-country citizens. At the same time, they are prompting new developments in European and International Human Rights law, as well as in other branches of the law applicable in emergency settings. The Jean Monnet Chair on European and International Human Rights Standards in Conflicts and Disasters (EIHRSCaD) aims at exploring these developments, mainly through research and teaching activities. Its objectives are to provide participants with an adequate level of knowledge of the role of human rights obligations in emergency prevention/management and inform the general public on these issues, to foster dialogue between academics and practitioners, and to support EU policy-making in this field. The yearly activities and outputs through which the objectives will be pursued include: (i) one five-day intensive course on "Human Rights in Conflicts and Disasters", open to academics and practitioners; (ii) eight courses on international and EU law applicable to emergency situations, covering human rights law, int.l humanitarian law, climate change law, int.l disaster law, int.l criminal law, offered at undergraduate, graduate, and PhD level; (iii) at least two workshops; (iv) one legal clinic aimed at assisting

humanitarian/human rights organizations; (v) a web site as well and social media accounts to disseminate information on the Chair's activities; (vi) one edited book, available open access. Roughly 200 students/participants each year will benefit from the projects' activities. It is hoped that they will mainstream human rights considerations in their academic and professional activities, and that European standards and best practices in this area will get prominence in the international debate.
